The Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, requires all Community Development (CDBG) and HOME entitlement programs to prepare and submit a Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) at the close of each program year. The Town of Hamden, Connecticut is an entitlement community for this program, as designated by HUD, and receives an annual allocation of CDBG funds. The CAPER provides the Town of Hamden and interested stakeholders with the opportunity to evaluate the progress in carrying out priorities and objectives contained in the Town's five-year plan.

The progress described in this report illustrates Hamden's efforts to utilize CDBG funding and enhance coordination with Community Development programs to create a more vibrant and livable community and improve the quality of life for low-income citizens in Hamden. Our team continued to prioritize the needs of the community while utilizing CDBG funds to forward the goals and objectives outlined in the Town's Strategic Plan.

This is the fourth report for the five-year Consolidated Plan period, which began July 1, 2020 and continues through June 30, 2025. In addition, in 2020 the Town received funding through the CARES Act for CDBG known as CDBG-CV. This report includes a status report on the continued use of those funds as well.

The annual allocation for Program Year 50 (July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025) was \$447,443. The total amount that the Town expended during Program Year 50, as indicated in the Integrated Disbursement and Information System (IDIS) reports included, was \$491,747.02. As allowed by HUD, 20% of the funds were allocated for program administration/planning costs and 27.57% were used. Program administration funds were primarily used to fund a portion of staff salaries as well as professional services, and printing and publishing expenses.

Over the program year the town distributed its CDBG funds in a manner that ensured decent, safe, and accessible housing for low- and moderate-income residents. First time homeownership assistance, shelter for homeless individuals, public service programming with a focus on youth, the elderly and disabled populations, upgraded community infrastructure, and eliminated blight conditions in the target area were all activities supported with CDBG funding. The Town continued providing assistance to income-eligible residents and residents within its target

neighborhoods in a timely and efficient manner.

Assess how the jurisdiction’s use of funds, particularly CDBG, addresses the priorities and specific objectives identified in the plan, giving special attention to the highest priority activities identified.

In the town of Hamden, Connecticut, the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds were strategically allocated to address critical needs and enhance the quality of life for the town's low- and moderate-income (LMI) populations, resulting in a series of impactful changes throughout the community.

Infrastructure improvements were a key focus of Hamden's CDBG-funded projects during PY 50. Several sidewalk and driveway replacement projects were completed during the program year. These improvements not only enhanced the physical environment but also contributed to a greater sense of community pride and well-being among residents.

Addressing homelessness and housing insecurity was a critical priority for Hamden. CDBG assisted the town in collaborating with local nonprofits to provide more comprehensive support services, including case management, mental health counseling, and job placement assistance. These efforts helped individuals and families navigate their path to stable housing, reducing the risk of homelessness and providing a safety net for those in crisis.

Hamden used CDBG funds to bolster public services that directly benefit LMI residents. Funding was allocated to community organizations that provided essential services such as emergency food distribution, health screenings, emergency response, and educational programs.

- The Clifford Beers Community Trauma Initiative provided care coordination and case management for 136 low- and moderate-income persons that experienced trauma because of COVID-19 related violence or other health/social issues having an impact on their daily quality of life.
- The Heating Oil Assistance program provided fuel assistance to individuals impacted by COVID-19, and activities are underway and will continue into the subsequent program year.
- Hamden CERT purchased an enclosed trailer to transport items needed for any Emergency Point of Distribution (POD).
- Funds will be used to cover program expenses related to Hamden Town Library's Digital Navigator and Broad Band Access program. Through this initiative the library deploys staff to work with residents to teach them digital literacy, connect them to local ISP providers at discounted rates, and when available and feasible provide hot spots, tablets, and Chromebook to residents to provide internet access.

Additionally, the Town of Hamden is utilizing CDBG funds for activities to meet the affordable housing needs of residents, including a homebuyer assistance program and continues to serve low- and moderate-income homeowners with necessary repairs to increase the habitability of their homes. Activities for these programs are currently underway.

As this is the fifth year in the five-year Consolidated Plan, Hamden did meet or exceed the goals established for public services, homeowner rehabilitation, and public improvements. The Town has simplified its goals for the next five-year Consolidated Plan. It is also actively working on new guidelines and public outreach to generate interest for its home Direct Financial Assistance to Homebuyers and Facade treatment/business building rehabilitation. The Town continues to prioritize providing public services and affordable housing to its income eligible residents.

Narrative

Narrative

In addition to the funds made available through the annual CDBG entitlement, the CARES Act Covid allocation continued to be available. To date, \$313,638.01 of the \$642,331 allocation has been expended. During PY50, an additional \$137,006.69 was utilized to aid in the recovery from the COVID-19 event.

Hamden's greatest obstacle to meeting its community development needs is limited financial resources. The leveraging of other resources is critical to providing a variety of programs and services demanded by residents of Hamden. In addition, the Department of Economic and Community Development has been working with various non-profit agencies and the Town's dedicated grant writer to bring additional resources into Hamden to specifically address Housing and Community Development needs.

Narrative

The Town offers housing rehabilitation, emergency housing assistance, accessibility improvements, downpayment assistance, and environmental hazard remediation assistance to income-eligible residents town-wide with a focus on Census Tracts 1655, 1656, and portions of the State Street Revitalization Zone (Census Tract 1651—Block Groups 3 and 4). Several programs are designed to occur only in the identified target areas to improve physical conditions and the livability of the neighborhoods.

The town's Emergency Housing Rehabilitation Assistance Program, funded with CDBG, is designed to provide emergency housing assistance to address code violations, lack of heating, accessibility, or conditions threatening the health and safety of residents. It is offered on a town-wide basis as long as the applicants meet HUD determined income guidelines. Access to the Fair Rent and Fair Housing assistance and Housing Code Enforcement is offered to all Town residents regardless of their income.

Leveraging

Federal funds have played a crucial role in leveraging additional resources in Hamden through various programs and initiatives aimed at boosting local development and addressing community needs. Federal funds have supported strategic planning efforts, which, in turn, makes the community more attractive to additional funders and investors who are interested in building on these planning efforts. See the PY 48 Annual Action Plan for an enumeration.

The Town has used land and property to address the housing and community development needs as identified in the Plan. In past program years, the then named Department of Community Development and Neighborhood Revitalization (DECDNR), along with the Mayor, spearheaded a project identify a Town-owned property for acquisition by Habitat for Humanity which allowed a low-income family to purchase the home at a price below market value. DECDNR also worked with Neighborhood Housing Services (NHS) to acquire a blighted vacant 2-family property in the target area and provided CDBG rehabilitation funds to complete the rehabilitation. This project also allowed a low-income family to purchase a home at a price below market value. The Town has also sold vacant properties to Neighborworks New Horizons to build affordable housing units in the Newhall neighborhood. The Town is receptive to identifying and using publicly owned property or land to meet housing and community development needs as new properties arise.

Columbus House and the Yale School of Architecture continue to work with the Town to identify town-owned properties for new housing targeted toward low-income households transitioning from homelessness.

A focus area that the Town is working on to create additional affordable housing opportunities is the development of partnerships with not-for-profit housing agencies. The Town will continue to collaborate with housing developers such as Regan Development Corporation, Neighborhood Housing Services, New Horizons, Habitat for Humanity, and Columbus House, on projects that result in affordable housing units for all citizens. The Town will explore partnerships with other housing organizations to further housing opportunities and will seek to leverage additional funding opportunities for housing related programs.

CDBG funds do not require a match from local governments or other entities, allowing municipalities to use the full grant amount for their designated projects without the need to

secure additional funding.

The PY50 Action Plan established the goal to create new affordable rental units and create homeownership opportunities to increase the supply of affordable housing. The down payment assistance program was developed to increase opportunities for low- and moderate-income persons to become homeowner. Applications were accepted and several have been determined to be eligible for assistance, and assistance is pending the applicant entering into a purchase agreement on an eligible dwelling unit.

The number of households reported as benefiting from affordable housing programs are representative of prior year goals for activities marked as complete during PY50, as reported on the PR23 report from IDIS, for housing rehabilitation activities.

Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs

In Hamden, Connecticut, the town's collaboration with the New Haven Continuum of Care has significantly enhanced its approach to homeless outreach and support. By leveraging the Continuum of Care's extensive network and resources, Hamden has been able to implement more coordinated and comprehensive strategies for addressing homelessness. As part of this, the Town plans to continue to be in direct contact with the Greater New Haven Coordinated Access Network (CAN), Columbus House, New Reach, Cornell Scott Hill Health Center Homeless Healthcare Team, the CT Coalition to End Homelessness, Yale Behavioral Health Services of Hamden, and Homeless Coordinator for the City of New Haven.

Involvement with these groups allows for a better understanding of the needs of the region and the various programs and projects with which they are addressed.

The following local organizations provide food pantry/ nutritional services to homeless individuals across the region: Dinner for a Dollar (Hamden); Keefe Community Center (Hamden); Faith, Healing & Deliverance Ministries (Hamden); Love Center Deliverance Ministry (Hamden); Ministry of Helps Foundation (Hamden); Breakthrough Church (Hamden); Home Pantry Mission of Dunbar Church (Hamden); Hasan Islamic Center (Hamden); Christ the Bread of Life Parish (Hamden); Faith Temple Revival Center (Hamden); St Rita's Church Food Pantry (Hamden); Downtown Evening Soup Kitchen (New Haven); Immanuel Baptist Soup Kitchen (New Haven); Community Soup Kitchen (New Haven); Sunrise Café (New Haven).

Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

Over the past program year, the Town of Hamden allocated CDBG resources to Columbus House to provide emergency shelter support to residents in need. Columbus House serves people experiencing homelessness or at imminent risk by providing life-saving outreach, shelter, and housing and by fostering their personal growth and independence. The Town also provided CDBG funding to support BHCare Domestic Violence Services to provide counseling to battered women and their families and to provide outreach and community awareness programming. Several Programs to provide food pantry/ nutritional services to homeless individuals and at-risk households were also supported with CDBG funding. Participants in these programs also receive referrals to additional supportive services and assistance.

The Town provided an overnight winter warming center from January through March. The warming

center is located at the Keefe Community Center and serves persons experiencing homelessness that seek refuge from the cold. Once at the warming center individuals/households were offered case management and assistance in obtaining emergency shelter. The Community Services Department is the primary source for locating shelter and supportive services for the homeless and households at risk of homelessness.

Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs

The Town utilized both CDBG and CDBG-CV funds for public services such as mental health services, legal services, youth services, food banks, and more in order to help low-income youth, individuals, and families avoid becoming homeless. The New Haven Continuum of Care (CoC) is dedicated to creating an effective and humane response to homelessness in the region, guided by a set of strategic priorities aimed at addressing the complex needs of those affected. At the core of their mission is the commitment to ending chronic homelessness. The CoC focuses on providing long-term supportive housing and comprehensive services for individuals who have experienced prolonged or repeated bouts of homelessness, ensuring they receive the stability and support necessary to rebuild their lives.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

As stated above, the Town of Hamden supports the efforts of the Continuum of Care to address homelessness issues through their funded organizations. The Town will continue to address homeless needs through its various social service agencies and through partnerships and relationships with Columbus House, New Reach, and CSHHC, among others. The emphasis of this approach will be to prevent homelessness by early intervention and the provision of necessary supportive services.

CR-30 - Public Housing 91.220(h); 91.320(j)

Actions taken to address the needs of public housing

No federally funded public housing units exist in the Town of Hamden. The Hamden Housing Authority (HHA) is a state-funded PHA and serves as a pivotal organization in addressing the housing needs of the Town of Hamden, Connecticut. Dedicated to promoting affordable housing and enhancing the quality of life for its residents, the HHA plays a central role in managing and expanding the town's public housing resources. The goals and objectives for HHA's 5-year plan include expanding the supply of assisted housing, improving the quality of assisted housing, promoting self-sufficiency of families and individuals, and continuing to maintain its high performer SEMAP status.

Residents of public housing, like other low- and moderate-income residents, are eligible for programs and services offered through the Town. They also benefit from the physical improvements made within the community development target areas and improvements to public facilities such as neighborhood or community centers. The creation of affordable rental and homeownership opportunities will also increase the housing resources available to public housing residents, particularly Section 8 recipients. As is the case in many communities, there is a need for additional Section 8 assistance to meet demands within the community.

Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership

The Housing Authority has a Resident Advisory Board that encourages resident participation in management and policy development. The Hamden Housing Authority will continue to promote programs, and expand its efforts, to encourage resident involvement and homeownership opportunities.

Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs

The Hamden Housing Authority is not a troubled PHA; therefore, no action was taken.

CR-35 - Other Actions 91.220(j)-(k); 91.320(i)-(j)

Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)

Fair Housing Plan: The Town of Hamden has created and is implementing a Fair Housing Plan as a way to provide formal guidelines consistent with federal affordable housing standards. The Plan is intended to be consistent with and meet the requirements and objectives of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, Title V or the National Housing Act (as amended), and all legislation related to non-discrimination in housing.

Zoning: Hamden has also implemented zoning regulations that help to promote affordable housing. Examples of some of these new regulations includes:

- Requirement that multi-family housing developments containing five or more dwelling units shall set aside a minimum of 20% of the dwelling units as Affordable Housing
- Determining the maximum price for all affordable housing units
- Determining the maximum price for all affordable rental units
- Building requirements for all affordable housing units

Barriers and Impediments: A potential barrier to affordable housing is the lack of convenient access to public transportation, which can directly impact the availability of homes to certain residents. While Hamden's diversity of residents and commercial opportunities is one of its greatest strength, the general limitation of public transportation to north-south corridors (specifically Dixwell Avenue, Winchester Avenue, Whitney Avenue, and State Street) serves to restrict the residential options of those without personal automobiles.

Another impediment to affordable housing is the lack of coordination at the regional level. There is a need to create a broad-based regional initiative to address the issues of affordable housing and fair housing within south central Connecticut.

Fair Housing: The Town has proactively established both a Human Rights and Human Relations Commission and a Commission on Disability Rights and Opportunities to ensure that Hamden's diversity is both celebrated and promoted, and everyone is treated with dignity and respect. These citizen organizations, as well as Hamden's Department of Elderly Services, Department of Community Services, and New Haven Legal Assistance collaborate to ensure that Hamden residents (and potential residents) understand the law as it pertains to fair housing and have opportunities through a number of channels to protect their rights.

Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

In Hamden, Connecticut, a collaborative approach among various social service agencies has significantly improved support for underserved populations. Local organizations, including the Department of Economic and Community Development, Youth Services, Community Services, Elderly Services and various Regional Continuum of Care service, housing authorities, and nonprofits, have united to create a comprehensive safety net. The Director of Arts, Culture, Wellness, and Recreation is responsible for oversight of the Keefe Community Center which houses the majority of the Town's community services departments.

By pooling resources and expertise, they address a range of needs from mental health and educational support to affordable housing and food security. This network of cooperation has been instrumental in transforming how services are delivered and ensuring that underserved populations receive the support they need.

Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The Town supports the Quinnipiac Valley Health District's applications for lead grant funding as a means to continue to extend its lead awareness program and offer assistance to property owners seeking to reduce lead hazards in homes. Where feasible, Community Development Block Grant funds are used to assist extremely low- to moderate-income households in the reduction/abatement of lead paint hazards. Likewise, the Office of Community Development and the Quinnipiac Valley Health District (QVHD) will apprise homeowners of any State or Federal loan programs available for the removal of hazardous materials.

Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

In Hamden, a multifaceted approach has been adopted to reduce the number of families living below the poverty line. The town has implemented targeted programs that include expanding access to affordable housing, enhancing educational opportunities, and providing comprehensive job training and placement services. Local agencies collaborate closely with nonprofits to offer financial literacy programs and emergency assistance, helping families achieve greater financial stability. Additionally, community initiatives focus on improving access to healthcare and nutritious food, ensuring that basic needs are met while families work towards long-term economic self-sufficiency. This coordinated effort has been crucial in supporting families in their journey out of poverty.

Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The Town's Department of Economic and Community Development, the Hamden Housing Authority, the Community Services Department, Elderly Services, the Office of Planning and Zoning, and the

Quinnipiack Valley Health District, function cooperatively to identify, evaluate and address the housing and community services needs of the various populations within the town.

The Town of Hamden combats cost burden and other housing problems of its extremely low- to moderate-income populations. The Residential Rehabilitation Program is the primary program used to expand the number of affordable units available in Hamden. Where feasible, the town works to promote the creation of affordable housing through outreach and collaborative efforts with area housing developers. As part of this, the Town of Hamden supports the efforts of non-profit and private developers who come forth with viable proposals to expand the Town's affordable stock. The Town actively seeks additional funding opportunities and appropriate properties to support the development of affordable housing.

The Department of Economic and Community Development administers the CDBG program with funding received from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). It plays a major role in encouraging and supporting the activities of private and non-profit developers interested in the construction and rehabilitation of affordable housing units. The Department of Economic and Community Development provides assistance for housing rehabilitation to extremely low- to moderate-income homeowners and owners renting to low- to moderate-income families. The office also administers a first-time homebuyer assistance program. The Community Development Specialist works to expand collaborations with realtors, bankers, mortgage brokers and non-profit housing developers to generate more interest in the first time homebuyer program and create new opportunities to expand affordable housing resources.

The Hamden Housing Authority manages the public/elderly housing complexes for the Town of Hamden. The Hamden Housing Authority also administers its Section 8 Voucher and Certificate programs and works to expand its Rental Assistance Program as a means of promoting housing opportunities for low-income/elderly populations. Over upcoming program years. The Housing Authority will also continue to investigate the possibility of creating additional housing resources. The Town has an active and supportive relationship with the Hamden Housing Authority.

The Community Services Department is the primary source for locating shelter for the homeless and special needs households. The Elderly Services Department provides care to elderly residents to prolong their ability to remain self-sufficient and independent. The Quinnipiack Valley Health District is instrumental in identifying lead paint hazards relative to housing issues, and Planning and Zoning approves the location of new construction and offers technical assistance to prospective developers.

The Town's Department of Economic and Community Development supports community development by its oversight of commercial and neighborhood revitalization projects.

Many of the supportive services offered to Hamden's extremely low- to moderate-income, and elderly/disabled populations, are delivered by non-profit organizations and agencies that receive funding through the CDBG program. The Town of Hamden offers a wealth of supportive services that

provide needy residents with appropriate support. The system currently in place has been successful in regard to housing extremely low- to moderate-income populations. While the elderly and populations with special needs are currently being served adequately, a gap exists between requests for affordable housing and available units.

Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The Town of Hamden will continue to assist and work with the Hamden Housing Authority, non-profit and private developers, and private industry in a cooperative effort to maximize resources directed to affordable housing. The development of this type of relationship will strengthen coordination between the Town, the community, and prospective developers in pursuit of affordable housing construction and rehabilitation.

The Department of Economic and Community Development will continue to collaborate with local social service agencies to maximize efforts directed to the expansion of affordable housing and supportive services. Through its Community Services Department, the Town of Hamden will maintain its involvement with the State Department of Social Services to address common issues and concerns and work toward programs to address identified needs.

Identify actions taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified in the jurisdictions analysis of impediments to fair housing choice. 91.520(a)

The Town of Hamden adopted an Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing in 2020. This document identified server impediments and actions for the Town:

1. Language and Cultural Barriers

Action: The Town has proactively established both a Human Rights and Human Relations Commission and a Commission on Disability Rights and Opportunities to ensure that Hamden's diversity is both celebrated and promoted. These citizen organizations, as well as Hamden's Department of Elderly Services, Department of Community Services, and New Haven Legal Assistance will continue to collaborate to ensure that Hamden residents (and potential residents) understand the law as it pertains to fair housing and have opportunities through a number of channels to protect their rights. These groups operate as an ad hoc Fair Housing working group for the Town, preparing, and providing information and group sessions across the Town. As demographics have shifted in Hamden, the Department of Economic and Community Development will enlist the support of translators to offer more information to non-English speaking residents.

CR-40 - Monitoring 91.220 and 91.230

The Town of Hamden's Department of Economic and Community Development is the local agency charged with administering the Town's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) allocation. The Town employs a part-time Community Services Outreach Technician, who is responsible for the coordination, oversight, and general monitoring of all program activities.

The Department of Economic and Community Development staff keeps detailed records and requires careful documentation for each program, especially with regard to low- to moderate-income status.

The Community Services Outreach Technician reviews reports submitted by Public Service Agencies and non-profits to ensure proper documentation of expenditures. Additionally, agencies are provided availability electronically to 2 CFR Part 200 to review allowable cost principles.

The Town also provides additional program oversight through a Community Development Citizens Advisory Commission (CDCAC), made up of resident volunteers. The CDCAC works in cooperation with the Department of Economic and Community Development to ensure the success of the CDBG program implementation and to provide citizen oversight. The group assists the Department of Economic and Community Development by identifying needs, advising on program guidelines, ensuring compliance with HUD regulations, and overseeing activities funded by the CDBG program. They also review applications and interview all applicants seeking Public Service Agency funding. As a Commission, they then make recommendations on which agencies to fund and how much they should be funded.

The CDCAC reviews and approves the public service agency allocations contained in the Annual Action Plan prior to its submission to the Hamden Legislative Council and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The CDCAC has nine (9) citizen members of mixed political affiliation, who are appointed by the Mayor and approved by the Legislative Council. The CDCAC meets monthly with the public to conduct their business and also meets regularly in smaller sub- committees to work on specific duties.

Procurement: All financial and purchasing transactions are conducted through the Town of Hamden's Finance Department. The Department of Economic and Community Development follows the Town's purchasing procedures and, in doing so, complies with 2 CFR Part 200. All financial transactions are subject to the annual audit of the Town's municipal finances.

Citizen Participation Plan 91.105(d); 91.115(d)

In Hamden, Connecticut, the town places a strong emphasis on transparency and public engagement when it comes to performance reports. To ensure that citizens have ample opportunity to review and provide input on these reports, Hamden employs several strategies.

First, performance reports are made readily accessible through the town’s official website, where residents can view detailed information about various programs and services. This digital accessibility allows for convenient review by the community.

Additionally, Hamden holds public meetings and comment periods specifically to discuss these performance reports. During these meetings, residents are invited to ask questions, offer feedback, and engage in discussions with town officials and program managers. These sessions are widely advertised through local media, social media channels, and community bulletins to maximize participation. Citizens were notified of the availability of the CAPER plan by newspaper advertisement in The Advisor on September 8, 2025, notifying the community of the opportunity to comment through September 24, 2025.

Furthermore, the town encourages written comments through online portals, ensuring that those who may not be able to attend meetings still have a chance to contribute their opinions.

By integrating these practices, Hamden fosters an environment of openness and accountability, allowing its citizens to actively participate in the oversight and improvement of local programs and services.

Soccer and Basketball Program is built around children ages 6-14 years old. Children are separated into groups based on age. The goal of the program is to teach the fundamentals and basic skills in playing the game. The program gives the children the opportunity to learn the game structure, rules and various skills. Children develop skills and attitudes that are required for the future through soccer, such as teamwork, sportsmanship, and problem solving. Business Education will have lesson plans formulated to help them understand supply and demand, money management and stock markets. Key aspects to the lesson plans are the instruction on basic money understanding, why money has value, the importance of saving money and investing money and credit card usage. The practical aspect of business education is to have the children use what they have learned and participate in a trading game on the stock market. In this game, the children pick stocks and trade stocks, track their performance over time and in the end discuss their gains and losses. Robotics has grown immensely and has become an intricate part of our lives. Its relevance and impact to fields as diverse as manufacturing, planetary exploration, medicine, healthcare, military, and consumer products is huge. Robotics is multi-disciplinary, a branch of engineering that involves the conception, design, manufacture, operation and overlaps with computer science. The goal of the program is to introduce and teach children the fundamentals of robotics. Give them the practical experience to learn engineering design and programming skills while allowing them to see and interpret code results in real time. Additionally, the children will develop professional skills such as planning, teamwork, and perseverance. The children will be introduced to various robot concepts, bots, and drones. Activity 3: Rocketry and Aeronautics The children will learn about the history of aeronautics and rocketry, the different kinds of airplanes and rockets, their components, rocket and airplane flight and their uses. The goal of the program is to open their minds that this branch of science encompasses many other disciplines. For the practical aspect, the children will gain hands-on skill in building rockets, airplanes and flying them. They will work independently or in a team setting Electrical Engineering With this program, the goal is to use Snap Circuits to teach basic engineering, electronics, electricity, physics, magnetism, circuitry concepts and computer programming. The children will use the building components with snaps to assemble electronic circuits on a simple. The resulting projects function like the printed circuit board found in most electronic products. The children will work as a team on many of the different projects. There are a wide range of kits with varying projects, varying size and complexity. The Snap Circuit projects are a good way for children to work as a team, to be challenged, to think, to develop their problem solving and communication skills and learn to inquire.
