# ORDER FURTHER AMENDING AND RESTATING ALLOCATIONS OF CORONAVIRUS LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS (ALSO KNOWN AS AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT FUNDS) (AS AMENDED 12-2-2024)

PRESENTED BY: Legislative Council

WHEREAS the Town received a total of \$24,140,338.00.00 in American Rescue Plan Act Funds (ARPA); and

WHEREAS, \$5,881,147.00 was previously applied as revenue for fiscal year 2021-2022 leaving a balance of \$18,259,191.00; and

WHEREAS, between October and May of 2023, the Legislative Council allocated \$17,947,500.00 for programs, projects and administrative expenses leaving a balance of \$311,691.00 which the Council allocated to administrative, project management and compliance costs; and

WHEREAS on January 22, 2024, the Legislative Council approved an amended and restated order reallocating certain funds and renaming and clarifying certain projects; and

WHEREAS, on or about May 20, 2024, the Council further amended and restated the Order approved by the Legislative Council on January 22, 2024, and ratified February 20, 2024; and

WHEREAS, on or about August 19, 2024, to account for the proposal from Haley & Aldrich, the Council further amended the Order to increase the funding allocated for evaluation and development of a plan for the Newhall Foundations Project from \$1,500,000 to \$1,800,000.

WHEREAS, on or about September 16, 2024, the Council removed the project entitled Equitable PTA, PTSA and PTO engagement and activities and reallocated \$154,000.00 in funding to Eligible Municipal Expenditures; and

WHEREAS, on or about October 7, 2024, the Council amended the Order to increase funding for the Community Campus by \$361,893.00 by reallocating \$361,893.00 from Total Administrative Expenses; reallocated \$1,700,000.00 from Newhall Foundations to Eligible Municipal Expenses; reallocated \$610,000.00 from Library ADA Improvements to Eligible Municipal Expenses; reallocated \$20,000.00 from Youth Mentorship (Daniel's Company) to Public Works Department; and relocated \$14,206.00 from the Small Business Grants Program to Public Works Department- equipment.

WHEREAS, on October 21, 2024, a Motion to Rescind the reallocation of \$20,000.00 from Youth Mentorship (Daniel's Company) to Public Works Department- equipment restored the funds; and

WHEREAS, on or about October 21, 2024, the Council replaced Daniel's Company with Fixing Father's as the vendor to receive \$20,000.00 for the Youth Mentorship Program; and

WHEREAS, on or about November 18, 2024, the Council approved the reallocation of \$200,000.00 from Library Social Worker to Eligible Municipal Expenses; and the reallocation of \$3,000,000.00 from the Community Campus Project to Eligible Municipal Expenses; and

WHEREAS, the Council wishes to reallocate 6,470,152.00 from the Community Campus Project to Eligible Municipal Expenses and \$10.00 from Hamden Alliance for Trees; \$15,000.00 from Youth Mentorship Program; and \$687.00 from UHY Advisors to Eligible Municipal Expense and rename the We are the Village project to "Summer Program Only."

#### NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Reallocate \$6,470,152.00 from the Community Campus Project to Eligible Municipal Expenses.
- 2. Reallocate \$10.00 from Hamden Alliance for Trees; \$15,000.00 from Youth Mentorship Program; and \$687.00 from UHY Advisors to Eligible Municipal Expenses.
- 3. Rename the ARPA funded project for We are the Village to "Summer Program Only."
- 4. Reduce the allocation of funding from \$185,794 to \$184,794 to correct the amount of funding in the Small Business Grant Program.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the Legislative Council amends and restates the Allocations of Coronavirus local fiscal recovery funds (also known as American Rescue Plan Act Funds as follows:
