1. Introduction

The Town of Hamden, CT, is a designated Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Entitlement grantee receiving funds on an annual basis from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The Town's CDBG funding is administered by the Office of Community Development (OCD).

The goal of HUD's community planning and development program is to develop viable communities by providing decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expanding economic opportunities principally for low- moderate-income persons.

Over its history, the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program has been a critical tool in ending blight, encouraging development in low-income communities, and helping lift families from poverty. With the support of Community Development Block Grant awards, the Town of Hamden seeks to provide critical financial, informational, and support resources to low- and moderate-income Hamden residents seeking to improve their access to homeownership opportunities, the quality of their housing, the viability of their businesses, the usability and effectiveness of their shared community facilities, and the cleanliness of their neighborhoods. The Town has established a system of citizen-based performance assessment to ensure that the programs and services offered effectively achieve the broad goals of the mission statement and meet community expectations.

2. Purpose of Proposed Amendment

The Town of Hamden seeks to reallocate unspent CDBG funding from Fiscal Years 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, and 2021. The reconciliation and reallocation of the unspent funds will be reflected as a substantial amendment to the Town of Hamden's 2021 Annual Action Plan. Please note that the proposed substantial amendment to the 2021 Annual Action Plan excludes funding under the CARES ACT (CDBG-CV1 and CDBG-CV3) awarded to the Town of Hamden and reflected in the Town's amended 2019 Annual Action Plan. The Town's spending plan related to the CARES Act funding received from HUD is being addressed separately as a substantial amendment to the Town's 2019 Annual Action Plan. The amount of CDBG funds under consideration for reallocation in the FY2021 substantial amendment is approximately \$773,742 and includes unspent funds from the fiscal years 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, and 2021.

4. Public Comments and Citizen Participation Process

Following HUD requirements as outlined in 24 CFR 91.105 and the Town's Citizen Participation Process, residents, stakeholders, and other interested parties will have a minimum of thirty (30) days to review and provide comments on the proposed substantial amendment to the Town of Hamden's 2021 Annual Action Plan.

Notice of the proposed changes to the spending plan in the FY2021 Annual Action Plan will be published in the Quad Town Advisor on November 9, 2022. Copies of the substantial amendment document will also be available for review at the Town of Hamden, Office of Economic Development, Hamden Government Center, and 2750 Dixwell Avenue, Hamden, CT 06518, and on the Town's website at https://www.hamdenedc.com/hud-reports-and-documents/.

The public comment period will commence on November 10, 2022, and close on December 15, 2022.

As part of the Citizen Participation Process and to facilitate public participation, the Town will convene two (2) public hearings: November 30, 2022, and December 5, 2022, respectively. The substantial amendment will be reviewed by the Community Development Citizen Advisory Commission (CDCAC) and approved by the Town's Legislative Council.

5. Town of Hamden CDBG Program Goals and Objectives

As part of its CDBG five (5) year consolidated planning process, the Town established program goals and anticipated outcomes. The current Consolidated Plan (ConPlan) is 2020 through 2024. The substantial amendment does not change any of the Town's program goals or objectives in the current 5-year ConPlan. The proposed changes to the spending plan in this substantial amendment are consistent with the goals and anticipated outcomes that have been previously established.

Introduction

The Town of Hamden uses several funding sources to address the housing, community development, and neighborhood revitalization needs of low- and moderate-income residents. The primary funding source for the programs outlined in this Annual Action Plan is the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. The Town was awarded a HUD grant allocation of \$498,595 in CDBG funding for Program Year 48 (2021-22). The proposed amendment seeks to reallocate approximately \$773,742 of CDBG funds approved under FY2016, FY2017, FY2018, FY2019, FY2020, and FY2021 Annual Action Plans.

1	Goal the Name	Increase Supply of Affordable Housing
	Goal Description	There is a need to increase the supply of decent, safe, and affordable housing opportunities in the Town. This includes a need to create new and rehabilitate both homeowner and rental housing units to meet housing and building codes, improve energy efficiency, and provide accessibility to those in need. There is also a need to encourage and support the provision of affordable homeownership housing opportunities. Homeownership helps to stabilize neighborhoods by increasing the number of permanent stakeholders or residents to an area.
		The Town will encourage the increase in homeownership opportunities through the rehabilitation of units appropriate for ownership occupancy, by providing support for non-profits and neighborhood development corporations in their creation of homeownership opportunities, through the provision of down payment and/or closing costs assistance, and by supporting programs which prepare households for homeownership.
		Increasing the number of affordable housing units and reducing cost burden for low and moderate-income households also falls under this goal. To address affordability, the Town will work with non-profit housing developers and community development corporations to increase the supply of affordable rental housing through the rehabilitation and re-use of vacant and abandoned properties. The Town will also work with and support the Housing Authority in its efforts to pursue the creation of additional affordable rental units.

2	Goal Name	Provide Assistive Services to the Homeless
	Goal Description	The Town of Hamden will continue to address homeless needs through its various social service agencies. The emphasis of this approach will be to prevent homelessness through early intervention and the provision of necessary supportive services. Services to be provided may include eviction and foreclosure prevention, referrals to agencies to provide rental and/or fuel assistance, counseling, food and household items, job skill development to increase household income, and short-term assistance payments to prevent eviction or foreclosure. The Town provides funding to area homeless shelters to support the provision of emergency shelters for unhoused residents. The Town also supports providing housing, programs, and services to help families transition from emergency housing to permanent housing.

	Goal Description	There is a need to provide housing and support services for elderly and non-elderly disabled households. Cost burden and the inability to maintain their homes are the most cited problems. The Town will provide support and assistance, as appropriate and applicable, to address the housing and supportive needs of the elderly and the disabled. The Town will also support the Housing Authority's efforts to obtain additional vouchers and create additional units to house the elderly and the disabled.

	Goal Description	Funds can be used to support the planning, design and construction of capital projects for property, buildings or facilities owned by the Town of Hamden. Eligible project activities include contracting costs to hire consults to develop architectural and engineering plans and studies. Procurement of consultants to design broadband infrastructure in underserved areas within Town; and to design and install sidewalks, trees, lighting, safety and to make green infrastructure improvements in eligible communities within the Town of Hamden.

	Goal Description	The Town of Hamden has identified specific segments of the community most in need of supportive social services. These include the homeless, elderly, youth, disabled, and other special needs populations. Services will be provided by local municipal departments, non-profit social and supportive service providers, and civic or neighborhood organizations. Ensuring all citizens have access to basic needs such as shelter, food, water, heat, and electricity; health care services including both physical and mental health services; transportation and supportive services for the elderly and disabled; counseling services to families and individuals at risk, and medical and health-related services will be targeted. Health-related services may include nutrition programs, immunization programs, health screening, and HIV/AIDS and/or Lead Poisoning Prevention programs. There is also a need to provide affordable, quality daycare and positive youth development activities. There is a need for an increase in care accommodations for infant, toddler, and pre-school-aged children, the provision of 2nd and 3 rd -shift childcare, and programs to meet the before-school, after-school, and school-vacation needs of youth. Positive youth programming such as recreation programs, cultural activities, anti-violence, and educational programs, especially those that target disadvantaged low- and moderate-income youth, are needed. The Town will focus its support on such programs during the strategy period. These programs will provide safe and constructive outlets for children and youth from lower income working parent homes as well as those lacking parental

While the provision of services for individuals and families that are homeless or are in jeopardy of becoming homeless is included within the Town's Five (5) Year Consolidated Plan Goals and Objectives, the Town's support of these efforts has been defined only as public service, non-capital funding support. As part of this amendment process, the Town is proposing the addition of new Project Activity, the **Development of Transitional and Permanent Supportive Housing.** Under this new Project Activity, the Town would be eligible to use CBDG funds to support agencies and organizations that are engaged in developing, constructing, leasing, or providing living spaces to individuals and families who are homeless or in jeopardy of becoming homeless. (These dollars are not intended to provide administrative programmatic support for agencies that are providing services to this population).
