About Six Lakes

Six Lakes is a 102.5-acre parcel in Hamden, Connecticut with mature forests, hiking paths, and six beautiful ponds. Home to deer, waterfowl, birds, fish, and turtles, its diverse habitats include a cattail marsh, a red maple swamp, and a 150-year-old oakpine forest as well as wetlands that connect to the Regional Water Authority's Lake Whitney water supply. Also known as Olin Powder Farm, the Six Lakes property is owned by the Olin Corporation, whose Winchester Arms division used the site for gunpowder storage and munitions testing.

We're hosting a series of visioning sessions on how the use of this space, once it is cleaned up, would best serve southern Hamden and the wider community. We'll discuss ideas, conduct hands-on mapping, and collaborate with our neighbors.
